Trainings content – The first day of training was focused on CDIO program, it's context, definition and implementation at Swedish Universities. The trainer Dr Kristina Edström gave clear understanding on importance and role of CDIO program on curriculum and course development. Day followed by providing information on strategies for change at KTH stressing students' role on enhancement of education, faculty development, national quality assurance policy and etc.

The major part of the trainings addressed sustainable development of education. Some hands on activities conducted by trainers to get better understanding and discussions indeed. Sustainability context could be considered challenging part of workshop for participants considering the real situation of less developed or developing universities.
