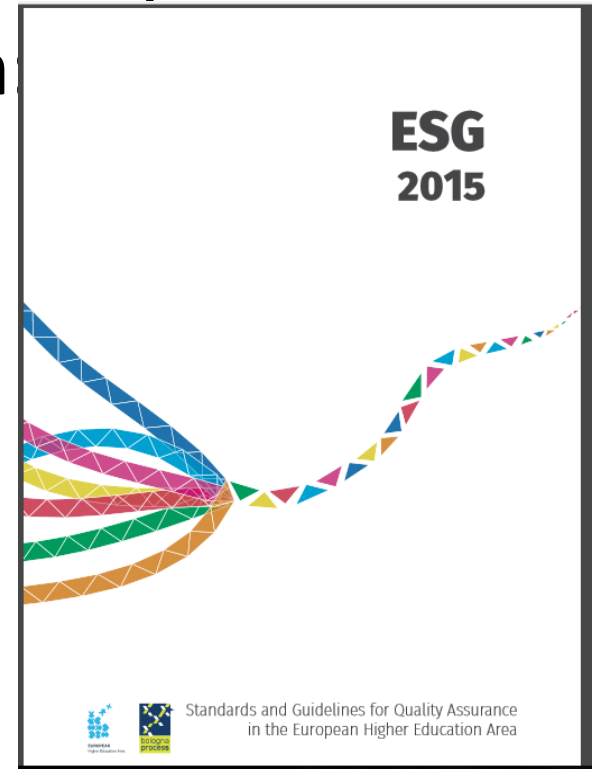

QUALITY POLICY PROVISIONS FOR THE STUDIES AND RESEARCH AT MYKOLAS ROMERIS UNIVERSITY

1. Mykolas Romeris University (further referred as – University), seeking quality of the studies and research, is guided by the Constitution of the Republic of Lithuania, the Laws of the Republic of Lithuania, subordinate legislation, international agreements and other documents of the higher education and research quality assurance and improvement. Implementing the study and the quality policy, the University takes into account the social stakeholders' needs and interests.

2. The main goal of University quality policy provisions for the studies and research is to ensure the international competitiveness and relevance of the higher education and research for the future needs of Lithuania, European and global society. Seeking this goal, community of the University will:

- responsibly and properly collect, develop, apply and disseminate internationally innovative knowledge and competencies in line with stakeholders, national and international public expectations and needs;
- individually and in academic community educates and fosters a culture of excellence, based on provision of cooperation, inclusion and trust;
- in the academic activities follow the Magna Charta Universitatum values, Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education, as well as international university codes of ethics provisions, consolidating academic freedom, university autonomy, academic integrity, and promote continuous improvement.

3. Management of the university in seeking study and research quality:

- unites, encourages the University community to achieve the highest possible performance and improves the competencies of its required to achieve the study and research quality assurance and improvement goals;
- properly and rationally allocates responsibilities, assures the transparency of the study and research process, the propriety and adequacy of resources;
- enables students at all study cycles to participate in the activities of quality assurance of study and research;

- having in regard external and internal changes, and the stakeholders' needs and interests, review and improve the quality policy provisions for studies and research and quality improvement goals periodically at once a year;

- ensures that quality policy provisions for studies and research and quality enhancement goals are understandable for all, implemented and observed at all levels of the University activities.

4. Quality policy provisions for studies and research are focused on the following areas:

- strengthening the relationship between teaching and research;
- development of student-centred studies;
- fitness of studies for students, stakeholders and public purposes;
- interdisciplinarity of studies, innovations and entrepreneurship education;
- internationalization of studies and research;
- electronic and virtual studies;
- scientific research on social innovation.

5. Quality policy provisions for studies and research are applied to all study cycles and research programs and University services. It is based on suitable and sufficient resources of the University and its partners, responsible cooperation and equal as well as proportionational application of quality assurance means.

6. These quality policy provisions are the basis for the system of internal study quality assurance and strategy for the enhancement of quality of Mykolas Romeris University.

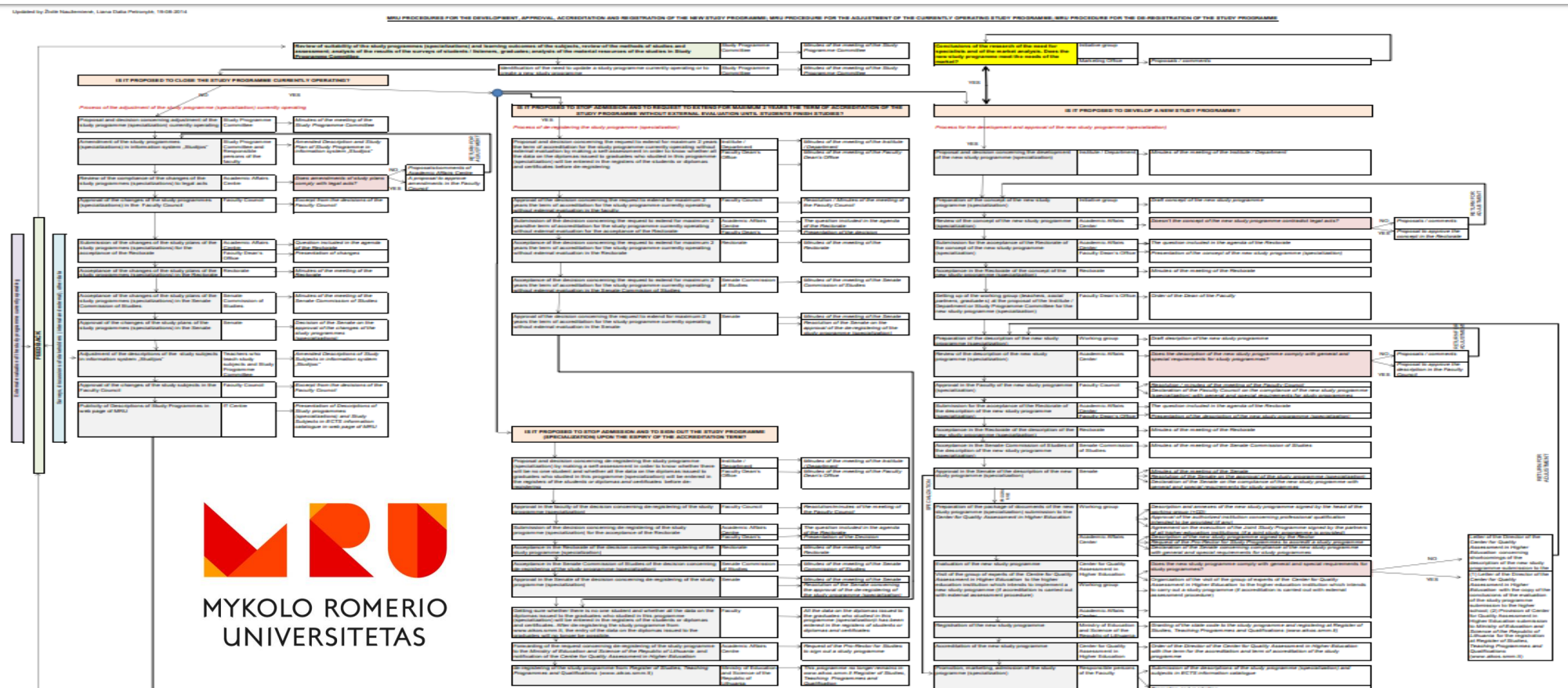

II. COMPOSITION

7. The Committee shall be composed of at least 8 members, including at least **3 teachers** who deliver the study programme, at least **2 students** and at least **one representative of social partners and graduate**. Students' representatives shall be approved by the University's Students' Representation. The Programme Head is a member of the Committee *ex officio*.

11.3. Provision of proposal on the selection of teacher and improvement of their competences.

11.4. Approval of the practice locations of the students of the programme.

11.5. Consideration and approval of topics of final theses, ensuring their compliance with the expected learning outcomes of the study programme.

11.6. Consideration of the outcomes of the study programme and students' feedback, provision of proposals for the improvement of the study process.

11.7. Monitoring of the adequacy of learning resources, provision of proposals for their renewal.

11.8. Help in preparing and approving self-analysis of the programme.

11.9. Together with the Marketing Department, monitoring and support of the marketing of the study programme.

11.10. Development of relations with academic and social partners.

11.11. Monitoring of students and graduates' career outcomes, offer of career development tools.

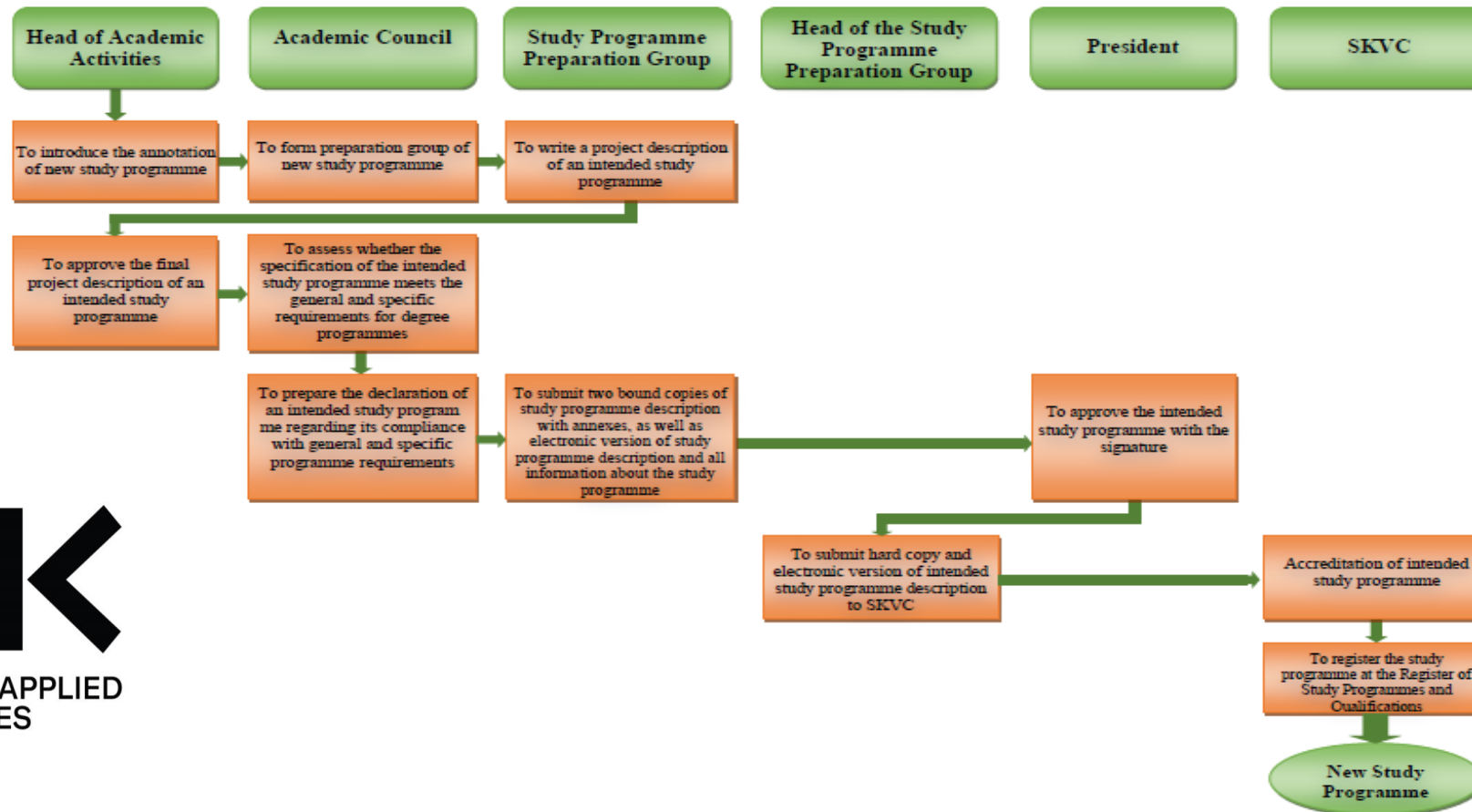

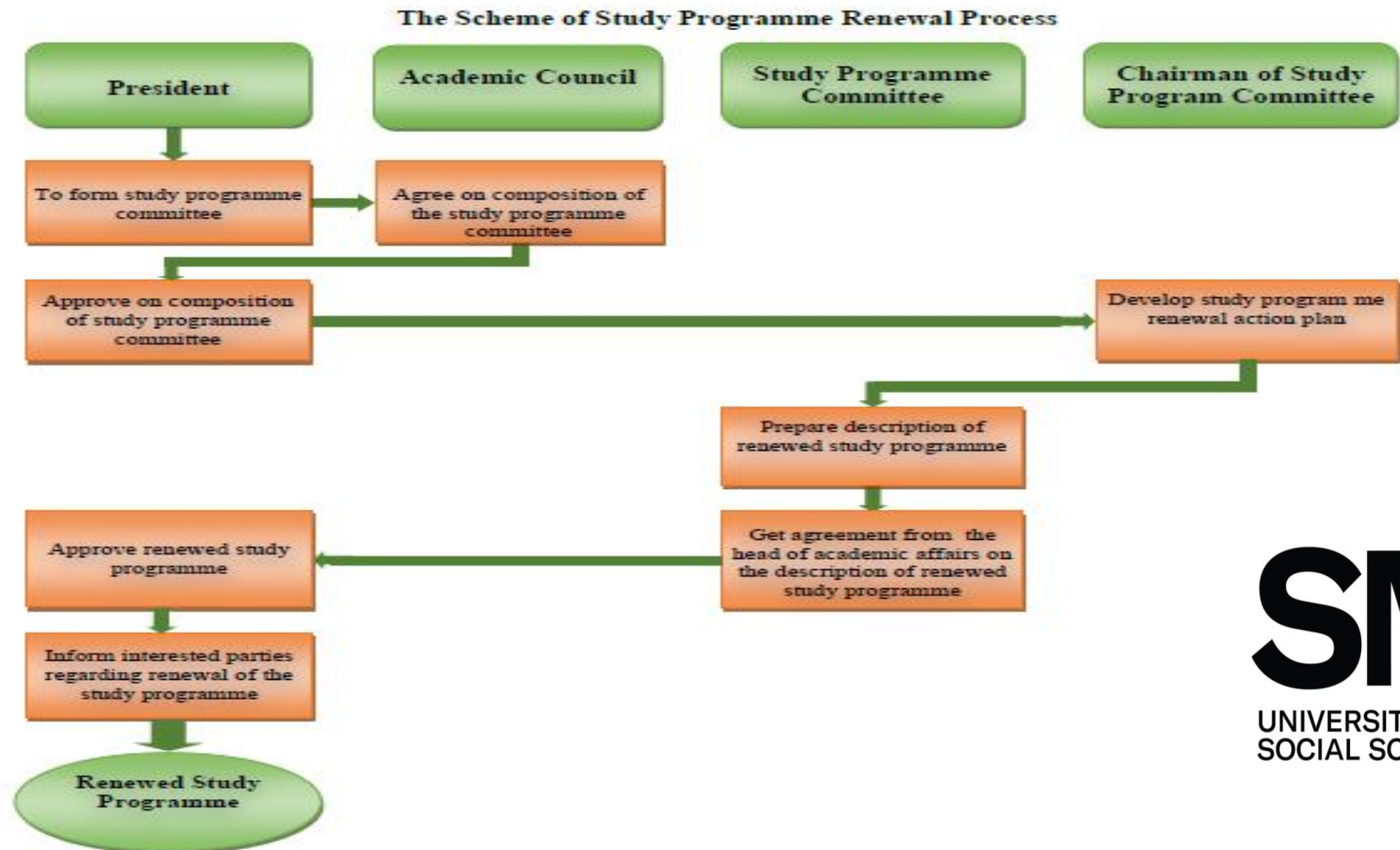

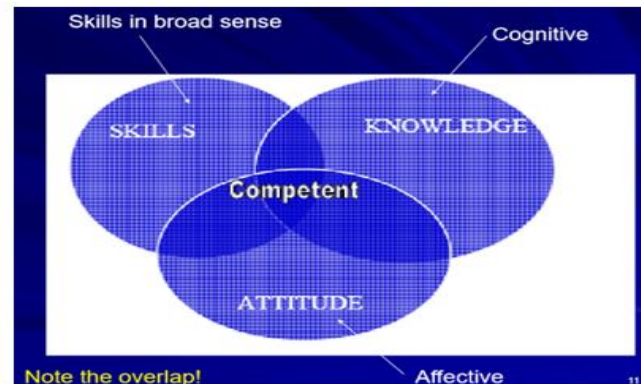

Accommodation

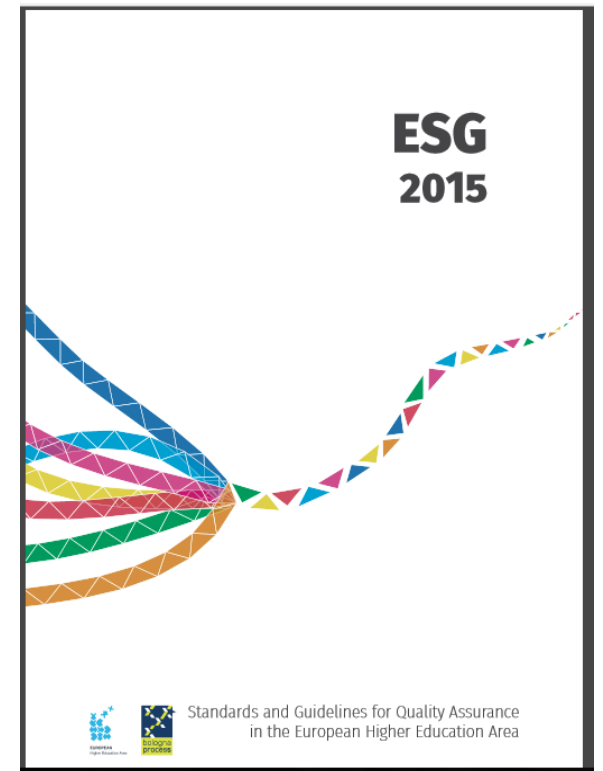

 - 2.3. procedure for quality data records identification, collection, compilation in indicators, obtaining, management, storage, maintenance and utilization.

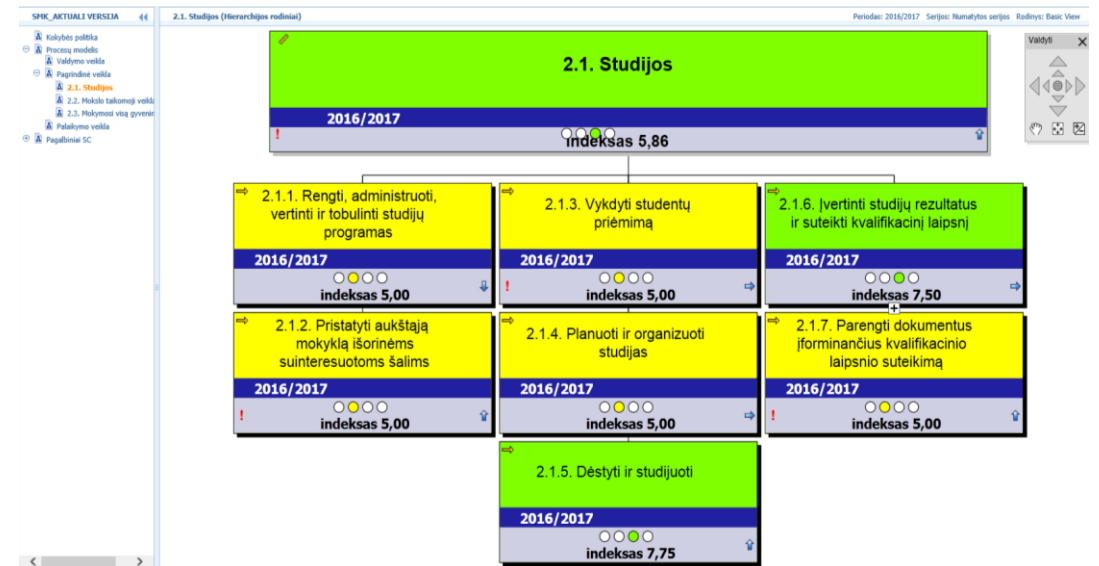
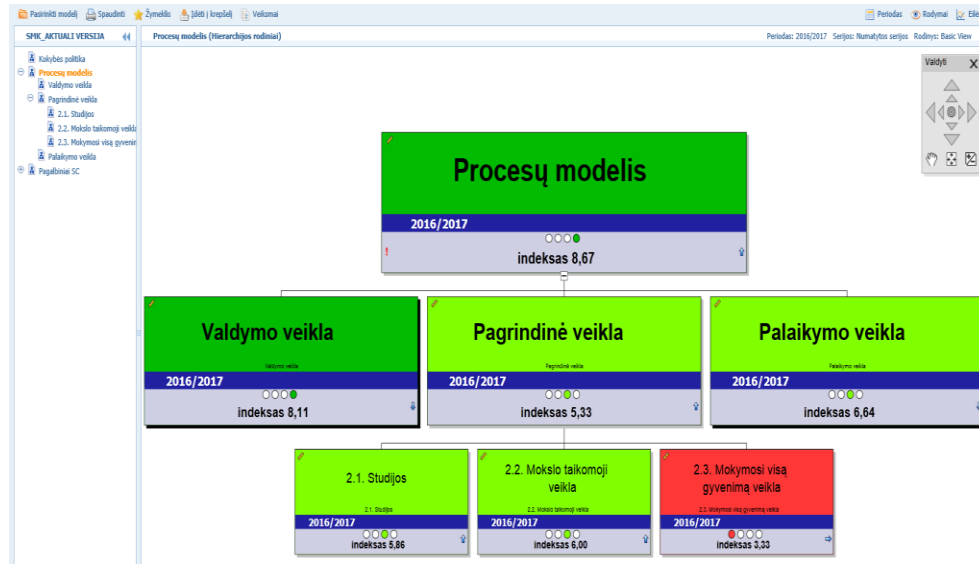

NATIONAL GRADUATES CAREER MONITORING

Graduates career is monitored by:

- Objective indicators of state information systems (when graduates find a job, situation of graduates in the labor market, the nature of employment, the wages, etc.). Indicators are collected 5 years after graduation and updated twice a year.
- Subjective indicators of sociological surveys (view of graduates on various career issues). Indicators are collected four times by surveys of graduates after the completion of studies (6 months, 1, 3, 5 years).

The data on how graduates of HE are entering the labor market as far as they are satisfied with their completed studies, work, and career helps HEIs monitor the results of study programmes, improve them accordingly and to ensure the quality of competency-based studies.

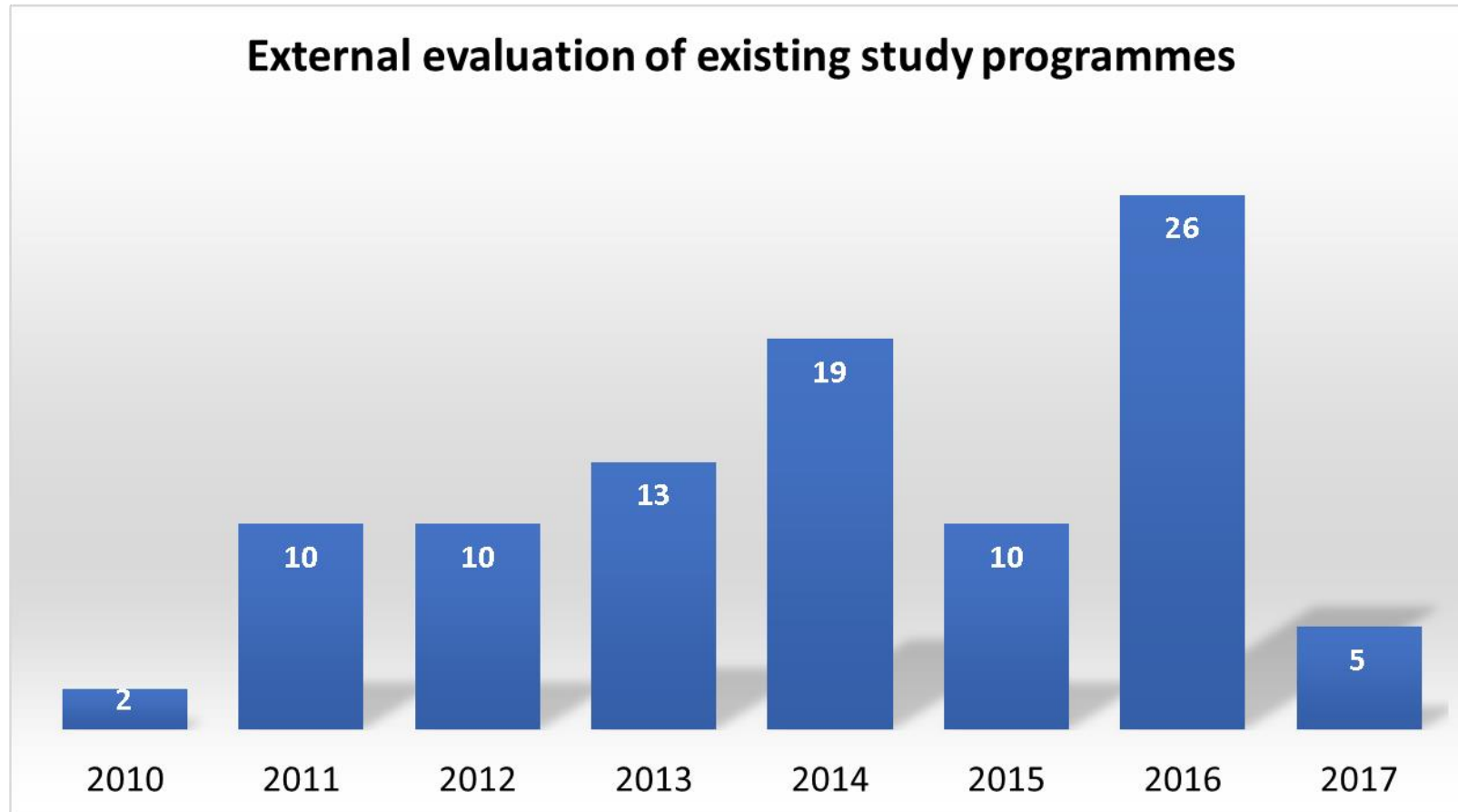

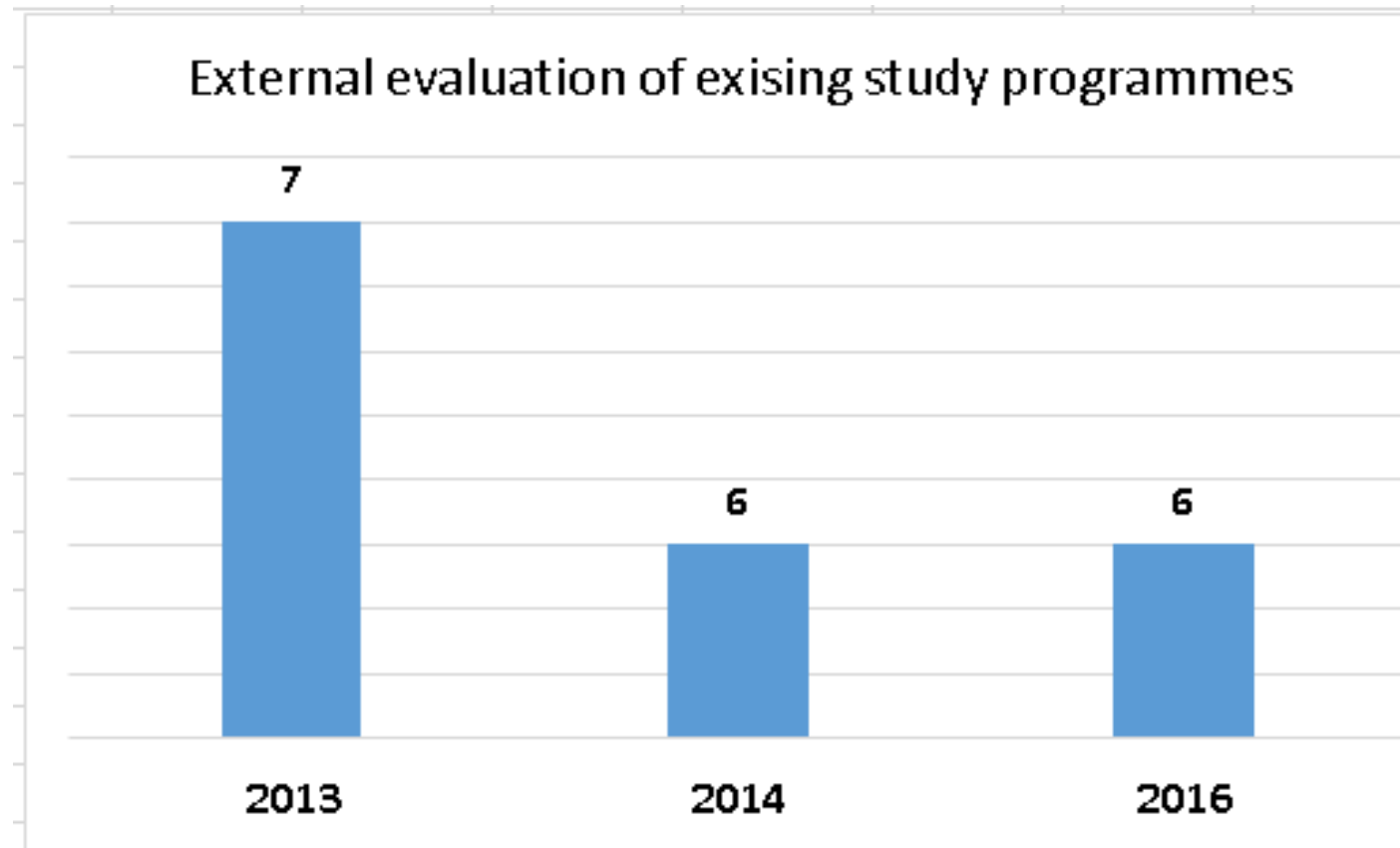
